WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

A Neighbourhood Plan is a document that:

- Sets out a vision for the future of the neighbourhood
- Shapes developments in the Parish
- Can influence the local authorityés view on new housing, public amenities, roads and transport
- Is written by the local community in conjunction with a steering group that includes residents from around Cossall and members of Cossall Parish Council

WHY DO WE NEED A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

Neighbourhood planning was introduced in the Localism Act 2011. It is an important and powerful tool that gives communities statutory powers to shape how their communities develop.

By developing a Neighbourhood Plan we will be producing a blueprint that will clearly state how the majority of residents in Cossall want to see the community develop in years to come. This will not be a document agreed upon by the chosen fewé As part of the Localism Act, there is a duty to present any plan to all members of the parish for comment and ultimately the document (Neighbourhood Plan) will have to be put to a referendum and must be approved by at least 50% of the residents of Cossall Parish. Ultimately Broxtowe Borough Council will have to approve the Neighbourhood Plan but once approved when considering development in the area, they will have to take into account the views expressed in the Cossall Neighbourhood Plan.
